Bassendean Youth Services are situated at 85-87 Old Perth

Road Bassendean, on the corner of Whitfield Street.

The Youth Centre is open for young people to 'drop-in' between 3 pm and 6 pm Tuesday to Friday, and offers a broadband internet and computer game café, XBOX, mini skate ramp, guitars, amps and drums, table tennis, squash courts and DVD movie projector.

Everything going on in the afternoons is free, and the centre is available for young people aged 12 to 25.

There is also stuff going on at the centre like LAN parties, graffiti art and sport most weeks. Once a month, there is an



activity on a Saturday and this year we plan to go ski-biscuiting on the Swan River, cycle and swim at Rottnest Island and also spend a day at Adventure World. Most of these activities only

During each school holiday period the youth centre runs a camp. We have held surfing and skateboarding camps, bush survival camps and have even been on a snorkelling expedition off the coast of Geraldton. The Youth Service is open during the day for



young people needing support with accommodation, legal issues, employment assistance and medical things etc.

Young people and the law... What is 'arrest'?

It is a process used by Police to bring people into custody so that the process of charging that person with an offence can take place. An arrest can take place anywhere—work, school, public places etc. Police can arrest you at any time of the day or night.



Can I be arrested if I have not committed a crime?

Yes, although Police must have reasonable suspicion that you have committed an offence for them to be able to arrest you.

What will happen if I am arrested?

Police must inform you that you are being arrested and why it is that they are arresting you. Usually they will escort you to the nearest Police Station where they will take a copy of your fingerprints and also take your photograph. You may be kept in a holding cell until a parent or guardian is present. Police will then interview you about the incident.
