Young people and crime— Dispelling the myth

Many people have an opinion as to the identity of perpetrators of crime within the community. Often, the information provided by the television, radio and newspaper media contributes to the formation of these opinions. Sensationalist stories pertaining to young people taking part in criminal activities only serve to paint a negative picture of this demographic, and are often not reflective of the true state of criminal activity within the community.

Whilst it is known that some young people—for various reasons—choose to engage in criminal behaviour, they are by far the most overrepresented group negatively portrayed in the media in relation to crime. Contrary to popular belief, young people are in fact the group who are least responsible for the majority of crime within the community.

According to a report prepared by the Crime and Research Centre at University of WA, Crime and Justice Statistics for WA 2003, adults overall are approximately 66% more likely than juveniles to be arrested in relation to criminal activity. The following graph provides a detailed breakdown of burglary and other theft offences by age status.

Bassendean Youth Services operates in the old Business Enterprise Centre at 85-87 Old Perth Road Bassendean.

The Youth Centre opens

3pm to 6pm Tuesday

to Friday, and offers a broadband Internet café, Xbox, skate ramp,



table tennis and pool tables. Everything going on in the

afternoons is free, and the centre is available for young people aged 12 to 25. There is also stuff going on at the centre like LAN parties, graffiti art and sport most weeks.

Once a month, there is an activity on a Saturday and we have done things like Bungy Jumping and Go Karting which only cost \$10 for the day.



Every school holidays the Centre runs a camp and have done things like caving and surfing lessons at Margaret River, a Survival Camp in the Swan Valley and Sand boarding at Kalbarri.

The Youth Service is open during the day for young people needing assistance with accommodation,

legal problems, employment, medical things, etc.

Programs like JPET also operate from the centre and help young people who are homeless or at risk of homelessness. The Youth Centre also runs services for families, young offenders and refugees.

Bassendean JPET—Job Placement Employment and Training

Bassendean JPET has been facilitated by Bassendean Youth Services for the past 8 years through the Federal Department of Workplace Relations. It offers assistance to young people aged 15 to 21 who are homeless, at risk of homelessness, wards, refugees, ex-offenders or those who are geographically isolated.

JPET is directed towards establishing stable lifestyles for young people through assistance with:

- Accommodation, drug and alcohol issues, financial problems, legal issues, counselling and ongoing support.
- Attaining life skills and creating stability through practical assistance.
- Re-entry into education, including pre-vocational and vocational training.
- Preparation for work.



JPET operates during business hours Monday to Friday from Bassendean Youth Services temporary premises at 85 Old Perth Rd. Ask for Lisa, Julia or Barry.
