Bassendean Youth Services

Bassendean Youth Services are situated underneath the McDonald Pavilion at Steel Blue Oval on the corner of West and Guildford Roads near the Skate Park.

The Youth Centre is open for young people to 'drop-in' between 3pm and 6pm Tuesday to Friday, and offers a broadband internet and computer game café, XBOX, band room, and DVD movie projector. Everything happening in the afternoons is free, and the centre is available for young people aged 12 to 25.

The centre also runs LAN parties, band rehearsals and activities most weeks. Saturday activities are also offered every couple of months. In the past activities have included: Adventure World, Go-Karting, Outdoor Rock Climbing, and Paintballing. Most of these activities only cost a few dollars per person.

Triple Zero (000)

Stay focused, stay relevant, stay on the line.

If someone is seriously injured or in need of urgent medical help, if your life or property being threatened, or if you just witness a serious accident or crime, then you should call Triple Zero (000).

Knowing how to call Triple Zero (000) in an emergency can be the difference between life and death.

The Triple Zero (000) service is the quickest way to get the right emergency service to help you. It should be used to contact Police, Fire or Ambulance service in life threatening or emergency situations.

Calls to Triple Zero (000) are free and can be made from mobile phones, home or work phones or pay phones.

Triple Zero not triple oh.

Put simply, 'Oh' is a letter and 'Zero' is a number. In today's world of growing technology, with almost everyone owning a mobile phone, you will note that the letter 'o' sits on the 6 key on most alpha-numeric keypads.

Dialing 'Oh' will result in actually dialing 666, and they will not access emergency services. 666 does not direct to Triple Zero (000) and there are no plans for this to happen in the future.

Steps for calling Triple Zero.

There are a few simple steps to take when making a Triple Zero (000) call:

- Stay calm and call Triple Zero (000) from a safe location.
- A Telstra operator will ask you if you need Police, Fire or Ambulance. Say the service that you require. If you are calling using a mobile or satellite phone the operator will ask you for other location information.
- You will then be connected to an emergency service operator, who will take details of the situation.
- Stay on the line, speak clearly and answer the operator's questions.
- Give the nominated emergency service operator the details of where you are, including street number, name, nearest cross street, and locality.
- Don't hang up until the operator has all the information they need.
- If possible wait outside at a prearranged meeting point or in a prominent location for emergency services to arrive to assist them to locate the emergency.
- If you make a Triple Zero (000) call whilst travelling on a freeway or highway, identifying the direction you are travelling and the last exit you passed will assist emergency services to correctly locate the incident.
